## COVID-19 CATCH-UP PREMIUM STATEMENT 2020-21

The COVID catch-up fund was introduced to support schools with the 'catch-up' work that would be needed with pupils following school closure during the coronavirus pandemic. Funding is provided to schools on a per pupil basis for the academic year.

As a part of the Government Coronavirus catch up fund CFBS has received a grant of £66,400 for 2020-21.

Central Foundation Boys' School has successfully supported our most disadvantaged and vulnerable pupils to achieve the highest of academic standards. In our response to the pandemic we continued to use our methods of supporting students, while also drawing on the latest research from the Education Endowment Foundation and the DfE to ensure the money is utilised for maximum impact.

Our programme covered two key areas:

1. Targeted Support: this included specialist small group support for those pupils with the highest levels of need and those that were the furthest behind.
2. Provision of learning resources to the students.
