# YEAR 10 CURRICULUM EVENING

## GCSE outcomes

- 48% of all grades achieved were at grade 7 (the 'old' grade A) or above
- 1 in 5 of all grades at grade 9.
- 51% of the students achieved 5 or more grade 7s.
- 92% of students achieved a grade 4 or better in English, and 88% achieved a grade 4 or better in Maths.
- 17 students achieved at least five grade 9s.

# YEAR 10 CURRICULUM EVENING



The reformed GCSE in Mathematics requires:

- the coverage of broader and deeper mathematical content;
- additional requirements to provide clear mathematical arguments;
- a greater focus on problem-solving;

## **Three x 1 hr 30minute exams**

- Homework is always set on SMHW to complete Hegarty Tasks
- For revision – little and often is best – not just once a week
- Three 20 minute periods a fortnight in form time
